



Research in France

The higher education system in France



Research in France

France is one of the world's leading research countries and research is conducted in all disciplines.

The research policy in France is driven by the Ministry of Higher Education and Research. Public research bodies and institutions of higher education and research are under the supervision of the Ministry.

France's universities maintain 3,000 research units/laboratories. Research units can be jointly managed by a university and one or more national research institutes (CNRS, INRAE, Inserm, CEA, etc.)

Research at the University of Bordeaux

With its academic research partners, the university encourages the development of research driven by curiosity, contributing to major discoveries in many fields of investigation. Together with society and the socio-economic world, it responds to contemporary problems by providing concrete solutions supported by scientific evidence.

The French doctoral system

The PhD degree is the highest degree awarded by French higher education, recognised at the European and international levels.

PhD students are enrolled and trained within doctoral schools, following their Master's degree.

They are trained for and by research within research teams.

A PhD is usually completed over a period of 3 years leading to one thesis defense. During the defense, the PhD students present their research work to a jury.

- > oversee the recruitment of PhD students
- > monitor the quality of their research

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How to apply for a PhD?

To apply for a PhD, you must hold a Master's degree or equivalent. Application requirements and procedures may vary from one doctoral school to another.

- 1 Learn more about PhD at the University of Bordeaux
- > Check the doctoral schools and the specialties
- > Check the prerequisites, funding, selection and admission procedures

2 Prepare your PhD project

Admission process may vary depending on the doctoral schools:

- > apply for a research topic from the doctoral school's list of topics (PhD positions with or without grant). The lists are published between March and June
- > identify a researcher who will become your future thesis supervisor and agree on a research topic before applying to the doctoral school

3 Selection process


- > Application on a research topic: examination, audition and selection by the doctoral school to award PhD positions
- > In the other cases, after the agreement of the thesis supervisor, the doctoral school assesses the application and issues an opinion

4 Finalize your enrollment

The registration fees amount to an average of 400€ per year, additional to the student life and campus fee which amounts to an average of 100€ per year.

Funding

for your PhD

A PhD grant (3-year employment contract) is the preferred type of funding, but there are many other ways to fund a PhD. Some topics are offered with funding, but it may be up to the candidate to identify a potential source of funding.

The PhD grant is a fixed-term employment contract (CDD). It may be one of two types:

- > a public law contract, issued only by public higher education or research institutions
- > a private law contract, issued by private sector companies

A few examples of funding:

- > contracts for the doctoral schools' selection process for PhD positions funded by the French Ministry of Higher Education and Research
- > funding for research contracts and targeted calls for applications
- > industrial conventions of training through research (CIFRE)
- > international grants
- > disability PhD grants

Other sources of funding or scholarships exist: research institutes, public authorities, foundations, associations and foreign governments, etc.

The Graduate

Research School

The University of Bordeaux's Graduate Research School is an establishment where training and research are closely linked. It coordinates the actions of the doctoral schools, and more generally the university's whole doctoral field.

It provides support services such as enrollment and thesis defense, training and professionalization process, international programs, scientific mediation, promotion and events, etc.

Training during PhD

PhD students must attend training courses during their PhD. It aims to increase their employability and help them acquire the skills needed for their career pursuit.

In regards to the University of Bordeaux's commitment to scientific integrity, each PhD student receives training in ethics in research and scientific integrity.

The university is also doing its utmost to be part of the process of making knowledge more accessible. Each PhD student receives training in the challenges of open science.

An international cotutelle doctoral program is a genuine partnership between two research teams in different countries.

Choose the cotutelle doctoral program!

The cotutelle doctoral program enables your PhD to be jointly supervised by the University of Bordeaux and a university institution abroad, with a view to receiving a double degree.

A cotutelle offers you a number of advantages:

- > shared mobility between two countries
- > dual expertise in supervising your research
- > access to the disciplinary and crossdisciplinary facilities and training courses at both universities
- > acquisition and development of your skills
- > expansion of your international professional network






Highly qualified teaching staff

The university employs around 6,000 staff members, of which nearly 4,000 are academic and research staff, recognised for the quality of their scientific and teaching qualifications.

Open to the world

The University of Bordeaux holds numerous partnerships with international universities (over 1,000 cooperation agreements have been signed with over 500 establishments worldwide).

A wide range of services

The Welcome Center for International Researchers aims to welcome and integrate international PhD students and their families (administrative integration, help with settling in, socio-cultural integration).

Language courses are on offer, especially for international PhD students who want to learn French.

They can also have access to the student health centres (general medicine, psychological support, social aid) and the other student life services (events, culture, sport).


